COMPETITION NEWS

Young Pianist Competition of New Jersey's Board of Directors would like to express their deep appreciation to **Elena Tatulian** and **Raffi Besalyan** for their exceptional performances during our Fundraising Series.

It has just come to our attention that The Plainfield Symphony Orchestra did not receive their annual grant to hold their Family Concert in March of 2005.

The Young Pianist Competition of New Jersey and The Plainfield Symphony Orchestra are still planning to go ahead with the concert; however, various changes will need to be made for the 2005 program:

- In order to be eligible to perform with the orchestra in March of 2005 (from the One Movement Division), the winner has to be performing a concerto either from the Classical or Baroque era. (Please note that qualifying Beethoven Concertos are only No. 1 & No. 2). This requirement is only due to the size of the orchestra.

Please note: Those winners who are performing either a Romantic or 20th Century Concerto will be given a chance to perform their winning Concerto in the spring of 2006 (provided that the orchestra will receive their annual grant).

- Those chosen to perform with the orchestra in March of 2005 will be asked to pay a fee of \$250.00 in order to help with the funds necessary to hold this concert. This fee is mandatory.

The Young Pianist Competition of New Jersey's Board of Directors would also like for you to be aware that we, as an organization give a large donation to The Plainfield Symphony Orchestra each year, in order for our winners to appear in their concert series. Unfortunately our organization alone cannot support this orchestra and we have no recourse but to inform everyone of this change.

MEMBER NEWS

LANA IVANOV was invited to give master classes and lectures at the Kazakh National Academy in Astana City, Kazakhstan in December 2004. She will be returning to Kazakhstan for another series of master classes in Astana and Karaganda in April/May of 2005.

YELENA IVANOV'S STUDIO: In January of 2005, Annabell Suh performed at the Crescent Avenue Presbyterian Church in Plainfield, NJ, as part of the Showcase for Exceptional Young Artists.

DR. RAY LANDERS: Several students participated in October, along with students of several other teachers, in concerts, sponsored by Jacobs Music and Steinway Inc., at Philadelphia's Kimmel Center and Trenton's War Memorial Patriots Theatre. These included Lilah Arrazcaeta, Arjun Ayyangar, Suveer Bhatia, Emily and Robert Cai, Michael Chen, Alan Fang, Arnold Kao, Christopher Lee, Emiko and Jake Myers, Eli Shapiro, Katherine Song, and Nathaniel and Stephanie Wong. Joining the studio of Dr. Landers for these recitals were Olivia Chiong, Savina Kim, and Matthew Lehman, students of Lilia Bigun, and Dante DiMidio, student of Carol Schamnely-Cahn. The Landers studio was honored to have raised several thousand dollars for the benefit of UNICEF and to have won second prize for studios, which raised the most money. Their prize will be a grand tour of the Steinway piano factory in New York City. The students enjoyed being able to play on the famous Steinway Grand "Peace Piano" at these two great halls; also several of them were honored to play and be recorded on the Peace Piano at Philadelphia's classical radio station, WRTI. Some of these will be featured playing and being interviewed, along with an interview with Dr. Landers by WRTI announcer Jill Pasternak, on a special upcoming broadcast about UNICEF and the Peace Piano student. 6 year old Arjun Ayyangar was honored to be featured in December on two national PAX network television "America's Most Talented Kids" TV shows; he had performed on two of the NBC versions of the shows last year. Another student, 13-year-old Eli Shapiro also recorded that show in California in December; his performance will be shown in February. Two other students, 13-year-old Robert Cai and 13-year-old Nathaniel Wong, are finalists in the show and will film their portions shortly. Arjun Ayyangar also appeared in November on the International Animal Planet TV show "Most Extreme Babies," and has been invited to appear shortly on two other national TV shows, "The Ellen DeGeneres Show," and "Good Morning America." Arjun will also be playing during intermission for 22,000 people at the New York Knicks/Miami basketball game at New York City's Madison Square Garden. This game will be televised live at 7:30 on February 9th. Arjun and Dr. Landers recently presented joint recitals in Haines City FL, Moultrie GA, and New Orleans LA, and Arjun in July played the Haydn Concerto in C major with the International Music Festival Concerto Orchestra. 15 other students from all over the world were also featured in concerto performances with the orchestra. Dr. Landers continues teaching at studios in his home in Yardley PA and in the Hopewell, Princeton, and Montclair areas. He continues to direct the International Music Festival at Baldwin-Wallace College near Cleveland OH. The festival celebrates its 20th year this coming July and it will also present a weekend music festival at the College of New Jersey in Ewing, near Trenton May 20 - 22. Dr. Landers also teaches piano and general music courses at the Buxmont Community Service Foundation Academies in Trevoise and Feasterville PA; these are alternative high schools for underprivileged youth. Several Dr. Landers' books, recordings and a curriculum guide for Suzuki and traditional piano students will soon be published by Warner Bros. YELENA MAMONOVA'S STUDIO: Justin Yeh was the First Place winner of the 2004 NJMTA Young Artists Competition, and Patricia Yeh received Honorable Mention. Erica Liu was the First Place winner of the 2004 CACA Competition and David Luor, Evaline Liu, Jerry Song and Victor La were winners.

GOLDA TATZ'S STUDIO: Stella Wong received a First Prize at the First Asia Bank Competition in New York. Her former student, Natalie Erlich, performed in February the Haydn Concerto with LMS School Orchestra in the Winners and Alumni Concert at Lucy Moses School competition in Merkin Hall.

VEDA ZUPONCIC performed the Shostakovich First Piano Concerto with the Portland Oregon Chamber Orchestra on January 29 & 30, as well as a solo recital and Master Class in Portland. **FROM VEDA ZUPONCIC'S STUDIO:** The Northern Lights Trio, consisting of Katelyn Tran, Joshua Kim and Brannon Cho, performed two recitals in the 900 seat Laredo, Texas Independent School District Auditorium on January 6 and 7. In addition to performances of the Haydn Gypsy Rondo Trio and the Beethoven Trio Op. 1 No. 1, they performed solo works. Veda Zuponcic provided commentary on the works performed. Alexander Timofeev, her student at Rowan University, won the Eastern Division of MTNA Young Artists competition. Julia Sheriff won the Junior Competition. Both students advance to the National Competition in Seattle in April.
